4	(a) Definition.—In this section, the term "foreign
5	adversary country" has the meaning given the term "cov-
6	ered nation" in section 4872(f)(2) of title 10, United
7	States Code.
8	(b) Prohibition.—The District of Columbia govern-
9	ment may not enter into any Sister City relationship with
10	a jurisdiction located in a foreign adversary country.
11	(c) Treatment of Existing Relationships.—If
12	a Sister City relationship between the District of Columbia
13	and a jurisdiction located in a foreign adversary country
14	is in effect on the date of enactment of this Act, the Dis-
15	trict of Columbia shall terminate the relationship not later
16	than the earlier of—
17	(1) the date provided under the terms of the re-
18	lationship; or
19	(2) 180 days after the date of enactment of this
20	Act.
21	(d) Loss of Certain Funds.—The District of Co-
22	lumbia may not use any Federal funds to provide liaison
23	and outreach services to the diplomatic and international
24	communities unless the District certifies to the President
25	that the District is in compliance with this Act.
