Viz:

1 Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the fol-
2 lowing:

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rescissions Act of
5 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. RESCISSIONS OF BUDGET AUTHORITY.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Pursuant to the special message
8 transmitted by the President on June 3, 2025, to the
9 House of Representatives and the Senate proposing the
10 rescission of budget authority under section 1012 of part

1 B of title X of the Congressional Budget and Impound-
2 ment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 682 et seq.), the re-
3 scissions described under subsection (b) shall take effect
4 immediately upon the date of enactment of this Act.

5 (b) RESCISSIONS.—The rescissions described in this
6 subsection are as follows:

7 (1) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
8 ing “International Organizations—Contributions to
9 International Organizations” made available by the
10 Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Re-
11 lated Programs Appropriations Act, 2024 (division
12 F of Public Law 118–47), \$33,008,764 are re-
13 scinded.

14 (2) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
15 ing “International Organizations—Contributions to
16 International Organizations” made available by the
17 Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (di-
18 vision A of Public Law 119–4), \$168,837,230 are
19 rescinded.

20 (3) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
21 ing “International Organizations—Contributions for
22 International Peacekeeping Activities” made avail-
23 able by the Department of State, Foreign Oper-
24 ations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act,

1 2024 (division F of Public Law 118–47),
2 \$203,328,007 are rescinded.

3 (4) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
4 ing “International Organizations—Contributions for
5 International Peacekeeping Activities” made avail-
6 able by the Full-Year Continuing Appropriations
7 Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–4),
8 \$157,906,000 are rescinded.

9 (5) Of the unobligated balances in the first
10 paragraph under the heading “Bilateral Economic
11 Assistance—Funds Appropriated to the President—
12 Global Health Programs” made available by the
13 Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (di-
14 vision A of Public Law 119–4), \$500,000,000 are
15 rescinded: *Provided*, That none of the amounts re-
16 scinded under this paragraph shall be from the un-
17 obligated balances for the following programs: HIV/
18 AIDS, Tuberculosis, Malaria, Nutrition, or Maternal
19 and Child Health: *Provided further*, That the pre-
20 ceding proviso does not apply to family planning and
21 reproductive health programs.

22 (6) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
23 ing “Department of State—Migration and Refugee
24 Assistance” made available by the Full-Year Con-

1 continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of Pub-
2 lic Law 119–4), \$800,000,000 are rescinded.

3 (7) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
4 ing “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Appro-
5 priated to the President—Complex Crises Fund”
6 made available by the Full-Year Continuing Appro-
7 priations Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–
8 4), \$43,000,000 are rescinded.

9 (8) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
10 ing “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Appro-
11 priated to the President—Democracy Fund” made
12 available by the Full-Year Continuing Appropria-
13 tions Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–4),
14 \$83,000,000 are rescinded.

15 (9) Of the unobligated balances under the head-
16 ing “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Appro-
17 priated to the President—Economic Support Fund”
18 made available by the Full-Year Continuing Appro-
19 priations Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–
20 4), \$1,650,000,000 are rescinded: *Provided*, That
21 none of the funds rescinded under this paragraph
22 shall be from the unobligated balances for assistance
23 to Jordan, Egypt, or the Countering PRC Influence
24 Fund.

1 (10) Of the unobligated balances under the
2 heading “Multilateral Assistance—International Fi-
3 nancial Institutions—Contribution to the Clean
4 Technology Fund” made available by the Full-Year
5 Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of
6 Public Law 119–4), \$125,000,000 are rescinded.

7 (11) Of the unobligated balances under the
8 heading “Multilateral Assistance—Funds Appro-
9 priated to the President—International Organiza-
10 tions and Programs” made available by the Full-
11 Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division
12 A of Public Law 119–4), \$436,920,000 are re-
13 scinded.

14 (12) Of the unobligated balances under the
15 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Ap-
16 propriated to the President—Development Assist-
17 ance” made available by the Full-Year Continuing
18 Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law
19 119–4), \$2,500,000,000 are rescinded: *Provided*,
20 That none of the funds rescinded under this para-
21 graph shall be from the unobligated balances for
22 Feed the Future Innovation Labs or the Countering
23 PRC Influence Fund: *Provided further*, That none of
24 the funds rescinded under this paragraph shall af-
25 fect the administration of United States commodity-

1 based food aid, including the Food for Peace pro-
2 gram and the McGovern-Dole International Food for
3 Education and Child Nutrition Program.

4 (13) Of the unobligated balances under the
5 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Ap-
6 propriated to the President—Assistance for Europe,
7 Eurasia and Central Asia” made available by the
8 Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (di-
9 vision A of Public Law 119–4), \$460,000,000 are
10 rescinded.

11 (14) Of the unobligated balances under the
12 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Ap-
13 propriated to the President—International Disaster
14 Assistance” made available by the Full-Year Con-
15 tinuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of Pub-
16 lic Law 119–4), \$496,000,000 are rescinded: *Pro-*
17 *vided*, That none of the funds rescinded shall affect
18 the administration of United States commodity-
19 based food aid, including the Food for Peace pro-
20 gram and the McGovern-Dole International Food for
21 Education and Child Nutrition Program.

22 (15) Of the unobligated balances under the
23 heading “United States Agency for International
24 Development—Funds Appropriated to the Presi-
25 dent—Operating Expenses” made available by the

1 Full-Year Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (di-
2 vision A of Public Law 119–4), \$125,000,000 are
3 rescinded.

4 (16) Of the unobligated balances under the
5 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Funds Ap-
6 propriated to the President—Transition Initiatives”
7 made available by the Full-Year Continuing Appro-
8 priations Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–
9 4), \$57,000,000 are rescinded.

10 (17) Of the unobligated balances under the
11 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Inde-
12 pendent Agencies—Inter-American Foundation”
13 made available by the Full-Year Continuing Appro-
14 priations Act, 2025 (division A of Public Law 119–
15 4), \$27,000,000 are rescinded.

16 (18) Of the unobligated balances under the
17 heading “Bilateral Economic Assistance—Inde-
18 pendent Agencies—United States African Develop-
19 ment Foundation” made available by the Full-Year
20 Continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of
21 Public Law 119–4), \$22,000,000 are rescinded.

22 (19) Of the unobligated balances under the
23 heading “Related Programs—United States Insti-
24 tute of Peace” made available by the Full-Year Con-

1 continuing Appropriations Act, 2025 (division A of Pub-
2 lic Law 119–4), \$15,000,000 are rescinded.

3 (20)(A) Amounts made available for “Corpora-
4 tion for Public Broadcasting” for fiscal year 2026
5 by Public Law 118–47 are rescinded.

6 (B) Amounts made available for “Corporation
7 for Public Broadcasting” for fiscal year 2027 by
8 Public Law 119–4 are rescinded.
