To provide for across-the-board rescissions of nonsecurity discretionary spending of 5 percent.

3 (b) RESCISSION.—For fiscal year 2026, and each fis-4 cal year thereafter, effective on the day after the date on 5 which appropriations are made available through Sep-6 tember 30 of the applicable fiscal year for the entire Fed-7 eral Government, there is rescinded, on a pro rata basis, 8 5 percent of the nonsecurity discretionary appropriations 9 made available for such fiscal year.

10 (c) OMB REPORTS.—For fiscal year 2026, and each 11 fiscal year thereafter, not later than 30 days after the date 12 on which appropriations are made available through Sep-13 tember 30 of such fiscal year for the entire Federal Government, the Director of the Office of Management and 14 15 Budget shall submit to the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate and the Committee on Appropriations of the 16 17 House of Representatives a report specifying the account 18 and amount of each rescission made pursuant to sub-19 section (b).
