A BILL

To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to provide a permanent disproportionate share hospital allotment to Tennessee for fiscal year 2026 and succeeding fiscal years, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Delivering Support for

5 Hospitals in Tennessee Act” or the “DSH in Tennessee

6 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PERMANENT TENNESSEE DSH ALLOTMENT FOR FIS-**
2 **CAL YEAR 2026 AND SUCCEEDING FISCAL**
3 **YEARS.**

4 Section 1923(f)(3) of the Social Security Act (42
5 U.S.C. 1396r-4(f)(3)) is amended—

6 (1) in subparagraph (A), by striking “subpara-
7 graphs (E) and (F)” and inserting “subparagraphs
8 (E), (F), and (G)”;
9 and

10 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
11 paragraph:

12 “(G) TENNESSEE DSH RESTORATION.—

13 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding
14 any other provision of this subsection, the
15 State of Tennessee shall receive a DSH al-
16 lotment under this paragraph beginning
17 with fiscal year 2026 and for each suc-
18 ceeding fiscal year.

19 “(ii) ALLOTMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR
20 2026.—Notwithstanding the table set forth
21 in paragraph (2) or the terms of the
22 TennCare Demonstration Project in effect
23 for the State, the DSH allotment for Ten-
24 nessee for fiscal year 2026, shall be equal
25 to the DSH allotment for Tennessee under
26 paragraph (6)(A)(vi) for fiscal year 2015,
 increased in each succeeding fiscal year by

1 the percentage change in the consumer
2 price index for all urban consumers (all
3 items; U.S. city average).
